This is a start to a list of characteristics of God that will help you in your study of beginning to know Him. It is vitally important to study Who our God is and have a knowledge of Him because it is the very foundation of our Christian faith. Every decision we make in our “everyday lives” should be impacted by what we believe about our God. Satan is the father of lies, and he wants us to believe lies about God, while the Bible teaches us the truth about God. Unless we study God’s Word and learn the truth about God, we will easily believe the lies of Satan instead of the truth about God. (For example, if a loved one is seriously ill, I can either believe that God doesn’t love me and isn’t in control, or I can believe that God always loves me, hears my prayers, is always in control, and wants me to grow to be more like Christ through this trial.)

I want to share a life-changing project that has helped me to begin to know God. Begin by purchasing a loose-leaf notebook. Using this suggested alphabetical list of some of the attributes of God, put one at the top of each page. Start by reading through the book of Psalms looking for God and Jesus Christ (or begin with the verses on this sheet). Every time you come across a verse about Him, write the whole verse out under the appropriate category. Continue doing this with all of your Bible reading adding any verses you find about God. You will soon have a notebook full of truth about your God. Any time a trial comes your way, you need assurance or encouragement in your daily life, or you want help for yourself or someone else, ask the question, “What do I know about my God?” and your notebook full of Bible truth about your God will be at your disposal. We often act according to our feelings (which are usually wrong), but as we meditate on Who God is, and how it affects our daily life, it changes our thinking and helps us respond to life biblically. Knowing God can mean the difference between victory or defeat, right choices or wrong, rest or distress, joy or depression!

It’s also special to use the categories during your prayer time to praise God for Who He is. I review one category each day and try to think about how it should affect my life. The next step is to memorize some of the verses and meditate on them until they become a firm part of your faith. This study can be a tremendous blessing and help to you if you will take a few minutes a day to work on it. It’s overwhelming to see how good and great our God is!! This absolutely changed my life and I hope it will be a help to you too!
